The 2024 Asian Squash Doubles Championships was successfully held from 4 - 7 July in Johor, Malaysia. This year's edition in Johor also served as important preparation for the 2026 Nagoya Asian Games, where squash will once again feature prominently.

WSF World Junior Squash Championships

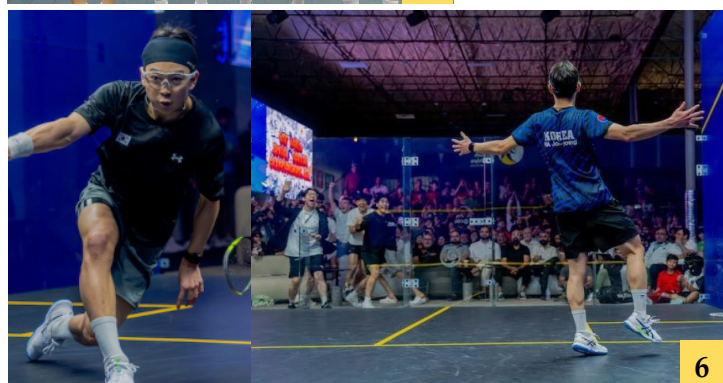
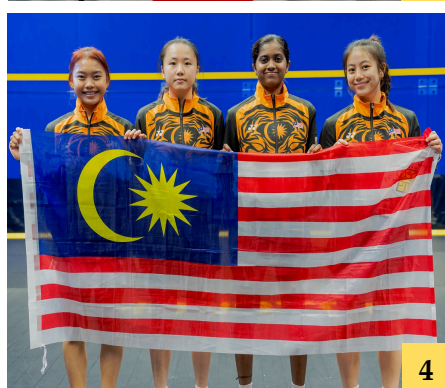
The WSF World Junior Championships was successfully held from 12 - 23 July 2024 in Houston, USA. Congratulations would go to Egypt, who swept all four gold medals, including the World Junior Men's and Junior Women's Team and Individual Championships. Asian players had a remarkable performance during the Championships. Korea achieved their first-ever silver medals in both the Junior Men's Team and Individual Championships. Malaysia also secured a third-place finish in the Junior Women's Team and Junior Men's Individual Championships. India claimed a bronze medal in the Junior Men's Individual Championships.

The participating teams from the Asian region at the Championships included Hong Kong China, India, Japan, Korea, Kuwait, Macau Hong Kong, Malaysia, Pakistan, Philippines, Saudi Arabia and Chinese Taipei.

In the last five months (April-August 2024) we had 3 ASF Championships: Asian Team Championships at Dalian China, Asian Junior Individual Squash Championships in Islamabad Pakistan & the Asian Doubles Squash Championships at Ipoh Malaysia (Photo 6).

Besides, we had a few online focal point meetings and ASF Referee Committee meetings to finalise ASF CBTA & ASF Assessment Sheet for referees. The ASF Referee Committee through its meeting finalise the names for ASF Elite Referees & ASF Senior Assessors. They also agreed to organise Assessor workshop to have an awareness of the new ASF Assessment sheet.

In addition, there were a total number of 38 clinics conducted in China, Hong Kong China (Photo 2), India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Saudi Arabia (Photo 1), Singapore, Thailand, & Pakistan. A number of 614 participants attended the clinics.

Referees clinics were conducted by Amos Yuen (Hong Kong, China), Anthony So (Hong Kong, China), Ashiya (Japan), Kellvintra Breshant Selvaraj (Malaysia), Ebrahim Kamal (Bahrain), Kim Chang Woo (Korea), Leslie Ponnampalam (Malaysia), Miyuki Adachi (Japan), Mohd Abdullah Arrffan (Singapore), Naved Kashif Khan (Malaysia), Sano (Japan), Srikanth Seshadri (India), Yogendra Singh (India) & Tahir Jamil Khanzada (Pakistan).

Assessment exercises were conducted in **14 events** with **158 assessments** in total, CNS International (8), World Qualifier Asian (4), 2nd South East Asian Junior Individual Squash Championships 2024 (15), CIMB NJC 1st LEG (16), Henri Carpenter Lion City Junior Squash Open 2024 (AJSS) (5), Asian Team Championship 2024 (17), PSA - Jakarta Open Squash Championships 2024 (Photo 4) (8), Dylum Cup 2024 (2), Asian Junior Individual Squash Championship 2024 (Photo 5) (15), CIMB NJC 2nd LEG (21), The Jessica HK Junior Open 2024 (11), HCL 80th Indian Senior National Squash Championship 2024 (Photo 3) (13), Hong Kong Championship 2024 (21) & Malaysian Nationals Squash Championship 2024 (2).

I would like to thank all the clinics/courses instructors and assessors in Asia and share their experience and support during the Championships.
