### Referees

A total of 12 referees clinics were conducted in Singapore (6), Malaysia (5) and China (1) by Munir Shah (Singapore), Mohd Abdullah Arrffan @ Robert (Singapore), Raymond Tan (Singapore), Leslie Ponnampalam (Malaysia) and Peter Chee (Malaysia) so far this year, involving a grand total of 304 participants.

Assessment exercises were conducted on 6 occasions in Malaysia (3), China, Pakistan and Macau in conjunction with championships on the PSA/WSA circuit as well as local tournaments. A tailor made Referee Assessor's

programme was conducted by Munir Shah (Singapore) during the Southeast Asian Games in Singapore. The pool of assessors in these exercises comprised resources from 5 countries, namely, Tahir Khanzada (Pakistan), Anthony So (Hong Kong China), Mohammad Fayyaz (Hong Kong China), Leslie Ponnampalam (Malaysia), Mohd Abdullah Arrffan @ Robert (Singapore) and Ebrahim Kamal (Bahrain).

These activities bear testimony that the development of referees in Asia is progressing steadily with a greater number of national and regional referees receiving assessments in competitive matches. Receiving valid assessments is a major challenge and the ASF Referees Committee will encourage more countries to embrace this path by ensuring that Asian referees are given priority in receiving assessments, wherever and whenever possible.
